C. Math/Science (MS/MSL) 15 Credits

- Select courses from at least THREE of the following disciplines, with no more than 10 credits from any one discipline.
- Include at least one laboratory course (L).
- Include at least 10 credits from the physical or biological sciences (*).
- A maximum of 5 credits of courses numbered 189, 199, 289, 299 may be applied to the 15 credit total.

III. ELECTIVES - (LE) 27-30 Credits

- Select courses from at least two disciplines.
- Students will complete a minimum of 27 credits of electives, including credits which may be in excess of the minimum general education requirements listed in I & II.
- At least 12 elective credits will be chosen from the Listed Elective list.
- A maximum of 15 credits of courses numbered 189, 199, 289, 299, 180, 190, 290 may be used in the elective area.
- A maximum of 15 credits of courses numbered 100 and above which are designated as Unlisted Electives (UE) may be used in the electives area. (These courses are not listed here; refer to the Course Catalog.)
- Listed Electives should focus on major preparation.
