Winter Road Trips Cater to Gardeners and Car Lovers

Bellingham, WA, January 23, 2014— The inspiring gardens of the Northwest Flower & Garden Show and the extraordinary workmanship of rare vintage cars showcased at the LeMay Car Museum are the destinations of two road trips offered through Whatcom Community College’s Community & Continuing Education program this winter. Enrollment is now open for both classes.

Join gardening instructor Debra Olberg for a road trip to the popular Northwest Flower & Garden Show in Seattle on Feb. 7. Participants will gain early entry to the show at 8:00 a.m., one hour before doors open and crowds arrive. Spend the day on your own strolling through the six-acre show enjoying full-scale gardens, free seminars, and retail therapy at more than 300 exhibits. Debra encourages the class to bring gardening questions for her to answer while on the road. Class departs from WCC Foundation Building promptly at 6:00 a.m. and will arrive back in Bellingham by 5:00 p.m., traveling by relaxing coach furnished by Bellair Charters. The \$79 course fee includes admission. Registration deadline is Feb. 4.

If you appreciate great workmanship, great art, great engineering, or just enjoy cars, the new road trip to the LeMay Car Museum in Tacoma—an extraordinary place that spotlights America’s love affair with the automobile—is a must. Led by an expert guide, the class will stroll through the history of transportation and cars, viewing more than 350 models and rare vintage cars, from Model T’s and Pierce Arrows to Duesenbergs and Ferraris. This March 22 road trip departs from WCC Foundation Building promptly at 8:00 a.m. and embarks for home at 2:30 p.m., traveling by relaxing coach furnished by Bellair Charters.
